


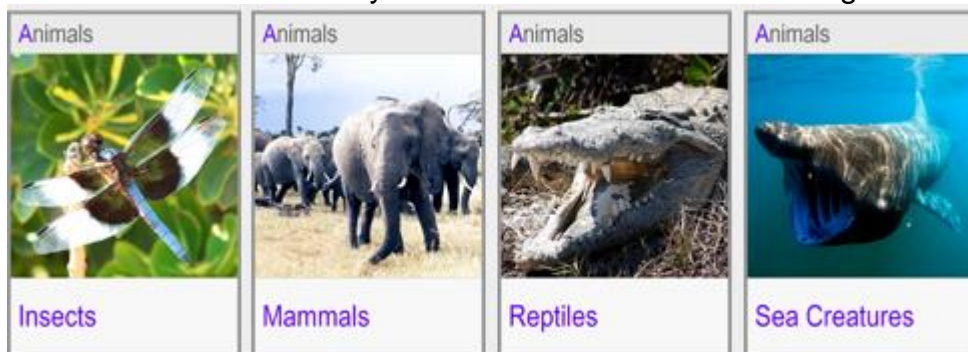

<b>Maths Learning</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Each day, access: <a href="https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-3/">https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-3/</a> You will find a teaching tutorial video for pupils to watch and learn from. This is a key skill, ideal to work on at home when talking about daily routines, how long tasks take to complete etc.</li><li>• You also have the Headstart Primary booklets which have already been emailed out. These have 52 pages of <b>maths</b> and <b>English</b> activities for year 3 (with an answer booklet too)</li></ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• You have been provided with a writing activity booklet Talk for Writing called ‘The Truth about Tolls’. There is a selection of lovely writing tasks which children can work through each day.</li><li>• There is also a spelling booklet for children to work through which has many activities suitable for years 3 and 4.</li><li>• Please continue to use spelling frame. In the years 3 and 4 section you can find all the spelling rules you need to know.</li><li>• Reading: Please spend 20 minutes per day reading. <a href="http://www.readon.myon.co.uk">www.readon.myon.co.uk</a> has over 7000 books accessible online free to read, many of which are on Accelerated Reader. <a href="http://www.stories.audible.com">www.stories.audible.com</a> is still offering free streaming of children’s books.</li><li>• Sumdog <a href="https://pages.sumdog.com/">https://pages.sumdog.com/</a> also provides reading and spelling activities.</li></ul>
