#### Dear Parents and Carers,

This week, it has been fantastic to see the engagement between home and school really increasing as we settle into our new routine. I have really enjoyed the introduction of our Zoom celebration assemblies; it's great to see the children so pleased to see each other and their teachers! Following the success of the first Zoom assembly, we have started to introduce class catch-ups at least once a week as we can see the benefit that these sessions have for the children's well-being. The class catch-ups will have various formats, including class games, storytime, show & tell and opportunities to share work that children are proud of.

We have received very positive feedback from the calls that staff are making to families of the children learning at home, and from those discussions, we have seen the engagement in remote learning increasing by the day. Using Class Dojo is by far the best way for children to access their work — teachers are providing videos to teach new learning and to explain the tasks, which is much more effective than just using paper packs alone. It is also much more beneficial for children to share their work with their teacher by uploading to their Class Dojo portfolio; this way, children get regular feedback from their teacher which is motivational for children, but also helps them to make progress. If you are not yet using Class Dojo in this way, please get in touch and we can help to set this up. We can also support by lending out iPads and WiFi dongles to families who need these in order to access their Class Dojo accounts.
