It was heartening to see the respect shown by our children during this solemn occasion. They also engaged in creating poppies as part of the remembrance activities. I'd like to extend my gratitude to Mrs Leighton for organising these meaningful activities. Our outdoor display will serve as a further reminder for this important event.

We were delighted to welcome Reverend Chris this week to explain the concept of the Holy Trinity. Using a candle and cross as visual aids, he helped our children understand that God is the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
