This hands-on experience helped them connect classroom learning with real-world applications.

The children were excited to share their handmade amulets and their new knowledge. I had the pleasure of speaking with several children about the workshop. E-mail Protocol for Parents

We greatly value your communication and strive to support our parents by responding to queries as promptly as possible. However, we have noticed an increasing number of emails and Dojos being sent to staff during days off, evenings and weekends, with the expectation of immediate responses.

During school hours, our staff are focused on ensuring the smooth operation of the school and the education of our children, which may delay email responses. Additionally, for the wellbeing of our staff, we do not expect them to receive or respond to emails during their personal and family time.

Expectations for email communications between parents and staff:

- Emails/Dojos from parents will typically be responded to in line with Marches Trust Email Protocol: Monday – Thursday: 7am – 6pm
 Friday: 7am – 5pm
- Parents are kindly asked to adhere to these time when contacting staff. Most systems allow for emails to be 'scheduled' in advance. Please use this function if you are writing an email outside of working hours.

Unfortunately, you are not able to 'schedule' Dojo messages so please refrain from using Dojo outside of school working hours.
